140 YEARS - 1880

Chesaning Sales Company/Ace

175 YEARS - 1845

Chesaning Union School District

- Our local schools started in a small shanty and were taught by Eliza Smith in 1843-44. The first frame school house was built in 1845-46 and, in 1845, the school district was formed. Today the district is part of the Saginaw Intermediate School District and serves a wide geographic area including several townships and the Village of Chesaning. The district has endured an unusual 175th year with students and teachers transitioning to remote learning due to COVID-19. We are applaud their commitment to excellence in education despite the challenges. Go Indians!
