Valentine's Beer & Wine Tasting Set for February 17!



HaPpY BiRtHdAy, Chesaning ~ 170 Years Young!

She looks pretty good for 170! Of course, she has had a few face lifts over the years (her most recent, the bridge over the Shiawassee River). But all in all, we live in a strong and vibrant community. Just think of before we even had a bridge; how would our town have been then??

It all started in 1819 with the Saginaw Treaty. This was a treaty signed between the Saginaw tribe of the Chippewa Indians and the United States. It established 10,000 acres of land along the Shiawassee River to be known as "the Big Rock Reserve". It wasn't until 1837 that a second treaty was put into place which led to the reserve being surveyed and offered for sale. The first property was sold for \$5 an acre and was purchased by George W. Chapman and Rufus Mason. (anyone have these two men in their family tree?) These men returned to Massachusetts to get their families and move them to their new home, which happened in the summer of 1842. In the meantime, other settlers came and started a sawmill and a grinding mill. The little village was called Northampton in honor of their homeland. In 1853, legislation changed the name to Chesaning, "Big Rock Place".

Our community has survived many ups and downs, not just familiar to us, but to our ancestors over 100 years ago. Our town was originally built on the east side of the Shiawassee river because of the forest setting, which provided much lumber to build stores. But because of coal heating systems, there were many fires which destroyed entire blocks. Eventually Chesaning moved to the west side of the river because of the fires and the arrival of the railroad.

The first township elections were held in 1847 and are considered to be the birthday of the community. The first elected officials were:

- •William Smith Supervisor and Justice
- •Rufus P. Mason Clerk
- •L Stevens Treasurer

This was the first saga of Chesaning. The Chamber would like to honor our town with a 170th birthday celebration on September 9th, 2017. Keep your eyes open for more details coming soon. Each month we will put a little piece of history in your news letter. We would love any information, pictures or old items from the past that will help make our celebration great.
