


### **Remembering Showboat**

Here comes the Showboat, here comes the Showboat, puff, puff, puff, puff, puff, puff-in along. Mammy and Pappy are feelin' happy, Shuff, shuff, shuff, shuff, shuff, shuff-lin' along.......

It's a sad day that we no longer get to enjoy Showboat, but we must remember the 75 great years she gave us. It all started in 1937, when the Chamber of Commerce decided to get into showbiz. Chet Howell, owner of the Chesaning Argus paper, spent years trying to convince the Chamber to put on a "Summer River Spectacular." Little did they know how successful it would become. The plan was that people would come to the local businesses during the day and see the show at night. Joe Swartzmiller, owner of Swartzmiller Lumber, helped build a boat. They designed the boat to fit the river. Admission was 25¢ for the show, and 25¢ extra for reserved seating. The show had 8 major acts, 18 men and 18 women for a chorus, 5 end men, a captain and local singers. Despite the cool, wet night, the show was a success. The profit that year was \$87.10.

The show was cancelled during WWII from 1942-1946, but resumed in 1948. For many years to come, the Showboat brought in hundreds of thousands of people to quaint little Chesaning. It also brought in millions of dollars in revenue to build a Chamber building, fire trucks, ambulance, park facilities and many more community projects. An array of worldwide talent came into our commu-

nity. Many of the entertainers would stroll through our streets, eat at our restaurants and play golf. A few I spoke to said it was a little mini vacation for them. They performed once a night, and had the



I had a harder time writing this than I thought. As I listened to "Here comes the Showboat", looked through old programs, pictures and went down memory lane, it brought tears to my eyes, sad and happy tears. We can't dwell on the fact it is no longer here, but remember the 75 years of amazing memories it gave us... the longest running festival in Michigan. Wonderful memories of all the shows and all the volunteers that made it happen. What fun times we had together! I remember when all the busses would come into town, you couldn't even cross the street. The town would unite and make our little village sparkle. Our hearts, sweat and soul went into this town. One week a year we wouldn't be business owners, teachers, students, farmers, patrons, or doctors.....we would just be one big happy family.....the Chesaning family.
