# **Putting Chesaning on the Map**

Your Chamber recognizes the value of having the Shiawassee River designated as a National Water Trail. Our letter of support to the U.S. Department of the Interior is below:

Honorable Secretary Bernhardt,

On behalf of the business, non-profit and individual members of the Chesaning Chamber of Commerce, we are writing to request your designation of the 88 miles of Shiawassee River flowing from Holly to Chesaning, Michigan as a National Water Trail. Already named one of the first eight State Water Trails by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources in December of 2018, the Shiawassee River is a valuable asset to all of the communities along those miles as a source of recreation and eco-tourism.

The river winds through the rich history of Chesaning, having been a settling place for both Native Americans and immigrants, and providing a resource for fishing, commerce and tourism. Today, residents and visitors alike enjoy visiting the parks and businesses that line our stretch of the water trail. It is common to see families fishing along the banks, paddling their kayaks and canoes downstream or gazing over its beauty while relaxing on the deck of a local restaurant. Designation as a National Water Trail would put a larger spotlight on the communities lining the Shiawassee and give our businesses, townships and village an additional marketing boost for tourism and relocation.

Through the efforts of the Shiawassee River Water Trail Coalition, there has been increased education in our communities to preserve and protect the river's natural resources as well as celebrate its natural and cultural heritage. It is the opinion of our Chamber of Commerce that designation of the Shiawassee as a National Water Trail will enhance those efforts and benefit the businesses, organizations and individuals who enjoy living, working and playing along its path.

We thank you for your consideration and encourage you to approve the Shiawassee River as a National Water Trail.

Although the flames caused about \$300 in damage to the ceiling of the burning building, the fire was extinguished and the firemen returned to the meeting with soot on their faces. The agenda was resumed and Chief Volker was reelected to the chamber's board of directors.

# Happy 40th Birthday, Mel Ervin Ford, Inc!

This is the story of Mel Ervin Ford Inc, as told in their own words...

Mel Ervin Ford Inc will be celebrating 40 years of business this coming December!
Mel's passion for driving Ford cars started early in his teens. Growing up in Grand Blanc, MI his dad worked for Otto P. Graff Ford for years, located in downtown Flint. There his interest in cars started, he attended GMI in Flint and worked in GM's Tool & Die Plant in Grand Blanc. After learning the craft there for about 10 years or so, and fixing cars in his own garage for several years, he decided to spread his wings and open his own little used car lot with a bump and paint shop in the back in the Grand Blanc area.

As the years went by and his business grew and became successful, he expanded into RV sales. Mel and Kaye had one of the

busiest RV sales in the industry but was still considered a "Mom & Pop" store. Kaye worked in the office preparing all of the contracts and balancing all of the books, while still answering phones, assisting customers, and helping in the accessories department. Mel handled the sales and service departments. Many late nights he would be delivering a unit to a family getting ready to head out on their first adventure in their new motor home or camper. # MMOGTA Celebrates Their 45th Anniversary

Congratulations to the Mid-Michigan Old Gas Tractor Association! Here is their story as told by Frank Young, who handles correspondence for the organization:

In August 2019, MMOGTA will celebrate its 45<sup>th</sup> year as a hobby and family-based entertainment venue in Brady Twp. In 1974, a handful of Brady Twp. families first got together to host a small, backyard threshing bee, as an opportunity to showcase some of the antique farm tractors and machinery they had accumulated and restored. At that point in time, it was largely a neighborhood event attended by locals and passers-by. By the end of that weekend, it became apparent that there was much more interest than any had anticipated. Others clearly had an appetite for what had seemed to be a somewhat obscure hobby. Within just a couple of years, the group had outgrown their original home on the Lawrence Haak farm, leading them to lease some land from another founding member (Walt Ritenburg) nearby. With each passing year the growth continued, with several incremental land purchases culminating in the spacious show grounds that currently



covers over 150 acres, including display fields, crop demonstration area, numerous buildings, campgrounds, parking and event areas. As impressive as that sounds, many feel that the club's greatest asset lies in its 500 member families, a talented and unique group of people from all walks of life, who add the hands, feet, talents, and personality that has allowed the MMOGTA to flourish, and become well known as one of the busiest, and most entertaining shows of its kind.
