



Sign 101—What Are Your Current Benefits?

With our sponsorship campaign underway to modernize our marquee, there have been many questions about the current signusage benefits. Below is our "Sign 101" to provide answers (and perhaps shed some light on why we hope to make a change!)

- Chamber members may call the office to reserve the sign for their special events or community messages. All reservations are made for 1 week, Monday-Monday, and are handled on a first come, first served basis.
- There is no charge for members to use the sign. Members have priority over nonmembers for reservations. Non-members may use the sign for a \$100 fee per week.
- Messages are limited to 3 lines of 19 letters/numbers or spaces.

- The office will organize the letters and numbers for pick-up on the Monday of the reserved week. There is also a pole with a suction cup used to change the message.
- Letters and numbers are easily broken, especially in cold weather, and caution is required to not damage the track.

If we are able to upgrade the sign, all messages will be changed by computer in the Chamber office and we would have far more flexibility and options to use logos, pictures, better punctuation, etc. We also would have the ability to run multiple messages each week, not just two. And no more worries about broken letters, track or putting the sign up in bad weather. Food for thought as your ponder the sponsorship opportunity!


Chesaning: 170 Years Young


