Chamber Newsletter Moves to Quarterly in 2020

In an effort to streamline our communications from the Chamber office and devote more time to member services, the Monthly Chamber Connection newsletters will become the "Chamber Quarterly Connection" beginning early in 2020. We will follow a seasonal format highlighting events and news relevant to winter, spring, summer and fall happenings in and around Chesaning.

Bell Telephone of Saginaw was established in 1879 and by 1898 a "Toll Station" was established at Albert Cantwell's General Store (the present location of Family Rexall Pharmacy at 202 W. Broad Street). This reguired customers to visit the store to place or receive a long-distance call at a predetermined time. After some local dissatisfaction with Bell Telephone, on October 31, 1908 a group of prominent residents signed an agreement to organize a company to buy the switchboard from Bell Telephone. The new company was incorporated as the "Chesaning Home Telephone Company" on November 14, 1908 with the subsequent purchase from Bell Telephone of Saginaw taking place on February 1, 1909 for \$9000 (so it could be said the this is the 111th year). The yearly cost of service in 1910 was \$18 for a business, \$15 for a one-party residential line, \$13.50 for a two-party line and \$12 for a four -party line. The new phone company established a central office in a 2-story building located at 140 S. Saginaw Street that is no longer there but is next to the existing CenturyLink central office at 144 S. Saginaw Street.

In 1950 the name was changed to Chesaning Telephone Company by the thenowner Vic Shapley. In 1959 the name was changed again to Central Telephone Company after acquisitions of 7 other Michigan exchanges. The company was sold in 1971 to a phone company from Monroe, Louisiana by the name of Century Telephone Enterprises. In 1999, after another corporate acquisition,

the name was changed to Cen-

turyTel. In 2008, during the largest acquisition to date with Embarg, the company name was changed once again to CenturyLink. In 2011 the company acquired Qwest Communications creating one of the largest communication companies in the United States. In 2017 CenturyLink acquired Level3 communications creating the second largest domestic communications provider.
